Lace Christmas Tree by Christen Brown



This felt project is a fun, fast and easy to make for yourself or someone you love! Use up your tiny bits of precious lace, appliques, and trims to create a hand-sewn collaged tree. The lace tree can be embroidered and embellished with stitches, buttons and more. It can be used as a pillow, or you could add a piece of ribbon to the top, for wall hanging.

Supply List

Prior Knowledge Needed

You must know how to hand sew and embroider. I used the following embroidery stitches:

- Straight Stitch
- Blanket Stitch

Any of my following books include both of those stitches. Or you can use the directions in any of your favorite embroidery titles.

- Embroidered and Embellished, by Christen Brown
- The Embroidery Book, by Christen Brown
- Hand Embroidery Dictionary by Christen Brown

Materials:

- 2 felt squares 9" x 12"
- 1 piece of batting 9" x 12"
- 1 piece of lightweight "Heat 'n Bond" 9" x 12"
- 2 yd. total of a variety of short pieces of flat lace in 3/8" 1" widths
- 2 yd. length of trim for the garland down the center of the tree
- 1 vd. length of trim for the outer edges of the tree
- 6 or more small flower or other shaped appliqués
- 34 50 buttons in a variety of small to medium sizes: these can be shank and/or sew-through
- Perle cotton #8 or #12

Options


- 6" piece 3/8" satin or grosgrain ribbon for a wall hanging
- 1 bag Fairfield Poly-fill, premium fiber fill stuffing

Tools:


- 18" ruler
- Scissors: craft, fabric, and embroidery
- Non-stick pressing sheet
- Iron and ironing board
- KK2000 Spray Adhesive or large Fabric Glue Stick
- Sheet of tissue paper to use to spray or apply glue stick to the base
- Straight pins
- Sewing thread: to match felt, lace, and ribbon
- Embroidery threads: perle cotton #5 or #8
- Needles: small sharps needle; cotton darner or crewel needle
- Air erasable pen
- Stuffing tool

Directions

- 1. Fold the piece of typing paper in half.
- 2. Draw an angled line, starting from the fold, ending about 1" from the side edge, and about 2 ½" from the bottom edge.
- **3.** Draw a straight line horizontally from the fold to the end of the angled point. (See suggested shape below.)



- 4. Cut out the paper shape (now called tree shape), with craft scissors.
- **5.** Pin the tree shape onto the piece of "Heat 'n Bond". Cut out the shape with fabric scissors.
- **6.** Place the pressing sheet onto the ironing board.
- 7. Cut the bits of lace for the tree with fabric scissors.
- **8.** Arrange the bits of lace (wrong side down) horizontally, onto one side of the "Heat 'n Bond" tree-shape.
- **9.** Following the manufacturer's instructions, iron the lace onto the "Heat 'n Bond" tree shape (now called lace tree).



- **10.** Carefully remove the lace tree from the pressing sheet.
- **11.** Place the lace tree face down on top of the sheet of tissue paper
- **12.** Spray the wrong of the lace tree with *KK2000 Spray Adhesive.
- **13.**Center the lace tree onto one piece of felt as shown.
- **14.** Place and pin a piece (or several pieces) of lace down the center of the lace tree for the tree base.
- **15.** Thread a small sharps needle with sewing thread.
- **16.** Pin, then hand stitch the outer edges of the lace tree and base in place.
- 17. Arrange the appliqués, bits of lace for the garland, the outer edges, and bottom of the tree, on top of the tissue paper.
- **18.** Apply the glue stick to the wrong side of each piece.
- 19. Place and pin these pieces of lace onto the lace tree and open areas of the felt as shown.
- **20.** Hand stitch these in place with sewing thread.



- **21.** Place the batting onto the tissue paper.
- **22.** Spray the piece of batting with KK2000 Spray Adhesive.
- **23.** Place the wrong side of the felt stitched with the lace tree, onto the batting.
- **24.** With an air erasable pen and ruler, draw in the lines for hand-stitching.
- 25. Stitch these lines with a straight stitch, using perle cotton #12, and the cotton darner or crewel needle.
- **26.** Audition and arrange the buttons as you wish.
- 27. Hand-stitch these in place with perle cotton #8, and the cotton darner or crewel needle.

Options

- Substitute ribbon for the edges of the lace tree.
- Lace can be substituted for the hand-stitched rows.

Wall Hanging

- **1.** Fold and pin the piece of ribbon to the wrong side of the top edge of the batting.
- 2. Hand stitch in place with sewing thread and a small sharps needle.
- **3.** Pin the remaining piece of felt to the batting side of the embellished piece of felt.
- **4.** Stitch the edges closed with the blanket stitch, using perle cotton #8, and the cotton darner or crewel needle.

Pillow

- 1. Follow Step 3 above, leaving an opening on one vertical edge.
- 2. Follow Step 4 above, working the stitches from one end of the opening to the other.
- 3. Using the stuffing tool, insert the stuffing into the opening, filling the pillow to the desired fullness.
- 4. Stitch the remaining section closed.
